During the spring, a training program titled "Orthopedic Shoemakers" was conducted for 12 people on the basis of the Republican Prosthetic and Orthopedic Center. Participants are from the target groups, and a majority of them are people with disabilities.

The program is designed for both novice shoemakers and those aspiring to master the profession of a shoemaker, helping them acquire basic knowledge and enhance their skills in orthopedic shoes production.

Throughout the course, participants have learned how to make various types of shoes and customize finished shoes according to fit the individual characteristics of the consumer. They have also learned techniques for cutting leather components of shoe uppers using a press or manual methods. Additionally, they received comprehensive information about assembling components for different types of shoes. The course was taught by Baimyrzaeva Bakytkan Sapanovna.


The program is implemented by the Public Foundation "Center for Innovative Technologies and Education" (PF CITE) with the support of DVV International.

#### **Adult Education Fest**

On June 2nd, the Adult Education Fest took place in Osh City.

This festival is marked the second consecutive year and has become an annual event in the field of non-formal education. Last year, June 2nd was declared as Adult Education Day, and it was also decided to hold the festival annually in different regions across the country.

Opening remarks were delivered by Khulkar Isamova, the Deputy of the City Kenesh, Mamyrova Gulnur, Head of the Department of Primary Vocational Education of the Ministry of Education, and Nargiza Turkebekova, Head of the Employment Promotion Department of the Ministry of Labour, Social Security and Migration of the Kyrgyz Republic. Nargiza also noted that, "According to statistics, 2 million 680 thousand people, unfortunately, 1 million 500 thousand people do not have a professional education...".

The overall goal of the festival has been and will continue to be the promotion Ωf information dissemination regarding adult education and to increase the demand for training and skills. It highlights the benefits of diverse forms of learning - learning for employment, non-formal learning. for and learning personal development.

The festival was organized by the Kyrgyz Adult Education Association (KAEA) and the public fund "Danida". The festival was supported by DVV International, the Mayor's Office of the city of Osh, and the Plenipotentiary Representation of the President of the Kyrgyz Republic in the Osh region.





#### **CONFINTEA VII Follow-up**



From June 6th to 7th, DVV International hosted a regional Follow-up Workshop for Partners in Central Asia in Tashkent. This workshop aimed to promote recommendations of the Marrakech Framework for Action: "Harnessing the Transformational Power of Adult Learning and Education".

The workshop brought together representatives from partner organizations spanning the non-governmental and public sectors, along with experts from civil society organizations and various stakeholders from the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Republic of Tajikistan, and the Kyrgyz Republic, including Ulan Aidarov, Executive Director of CITE; Igor Litvinov, Director of ADRA Kyrgyzstan; Madina Sarkulova, Executive Director of Institute for Youth Development; Larisa Kislova, President of Information Resource Center; and Sharshenova Damira, Coordinator of Qualification Upgrading of KSU named after I.Arabayev.

The purpose of the workshop was to support sustainable development and provision of information and practical skills to partners for promoting the Marrakesh Framework for Action within their countries and region.

The workshop was initiated and organized by DVV International, and the coorganizer was UNESCO Office in Tashkent.


#### **Curriculum globALE**


Curriculum globALE (CG) is a cross-cultural, output-oriented core curriculum for training adult educators worldwide.

### Visit to the Balykchy Regional Center for the Development and Education of the Population (Balykchy RCDEP)

Dr. Uwe Gartenschleger, Deputy Director of DVV International, and Specialist for Central and South Asia DVV International, Dr. Kathleen Glenz, as well as representatives of the regional office of DVV International, visited the Balykchy RCDEP.

The guests held a meeting with Beishen Isabekov, director of the Balykchy RCDEP, as well as center's partners: Erkebayev Rashid,head of the Employment Department; Rahmanov Omurbek, officer of Balykchy city Council; Abakirov Temirbek, Head of Crocus security agency.





During the meeting, Beishan Isabekov delivered a presentation about the center, focusing on successful and sustainable projects. For instance, he highlighted the horticulture, where participants have effectively applied their acquired knowledge to establish nurseries in their household plots.

#### A new life with new skills

The opening ceremony of a training class for a baker-confectioner took place at the branch of Vocational School No. 1 in Penitentiary Execution No. 51 of the Penitentiary Service, Ministry of Justice of the Kyrgyz Republic in Balykchy. The classroom was equipped with all the necessary equipment, and a major overhaul was carried out. Now, the convicts will be able to learn how to bake various confectionery products, earn money, and be released as a specialist with experience. In addition, not only convicts but also clients of the interregional department of the Probation Department, Ministry of Justice of the Kyrgyz Republic in the Issyk-Kul and Naryn regions, will be able to undergo training.



The director of the branch of Vocational School No. 1, a teacher with many years of experience, Maria Galliulina, emphasized:

"The project began in the spring, but even in such a short period of time, we managed to overhaul one of the premises of the colony and equip the class with the necessary equipment, modern inventory, tools, and furniture. I am sure that students will leave us with a bundle of knowledge that will later help them get used to life, forget about the negative past, and take care of themselves and their families."

The project will be continued; in the future, training will be transferred to budget funding. The plans of the leadership of the vocational school and institution No. 51 are to combine the process of acquiring skills with the development of their own production of confectionery products.

The profession is highly demanded in the labor market. Penitentiary Execution No. 51 already has its own bakery, baking bread for hospitals, military units, and children's institutions in Balykchy.


